The purpose of this procedure is to provide a consolidated summary of the required frequency of inspections and sampling for each activity. The inspection and sampling frequency is generally mandated by law or rule. The frequencies are considered minimums necessary for a sound environmental health program.

Samples 2 sets per year, 1 at opening for outdoor (sample set = 1 shallow, 1 deep, 1 wading)

(bathing beach set = 2 different locations)

On-Site Sewage System Inspections Initial installation and complaint basis

Community Water Supply Inspections 1 per 3 years \*\*

Samples As indicated by EED District Engineer

Non-Community Water Supply Inspections 1 per 5 years \*\*

Samples As indicated by EED District Engineer

\*Water Samples for Transient and Non-Transient Public Supplies for permitted facilities only

\*\*Public Water Systems are inspected by EED District Offices
